

Challenge Course & Ropes Initiatives

Part 2 of Challenge Course Ropes & Initiatives Facilitator Training includes Girl Scout activities that are appropriate for adults to do with Girl Scout Juniors, Girl Scout Cadettes, Girl Scout Seniors, Girl Scout Ambassadors and adults. Completion of this class meets the requirements for an adult to become a low ropes course facilitator using the Camp Skimino course if trained on the Camp Skimino course or Camp Darden course if trained on the Camp Darden course, and meets the guidelines in *Safety Activity Checkpoints*. Learn to facilitate activities on fixed initiatives and low ropes course elements. Experience more games and problem solving activities, learn spotting techniques, how to use the obstacles and elements, and maintain safety.

You will be preparing a one-pot entrée along with a no cook recipe as well as cooking using foil. You should plan on eating during this course.



Classes by Request

Custom classes may be requested by submitting a <u>Classes by Request</u> form, which can be found in the forms section of the council website. A minimum of five participants required. Requests must be made no less than six weeks in advance of a preferred date. At least two choices of dates must be indicated. For classes requiring fees, payment must accompany registrations. See <u>Classes by Request</u> form for more details and submission instructions.

Volunteer Course Guidelines

Who can attend? - Any registered adult or girl member age 14 or older (with a parent permission slip & Girl Health History) may attend volunteer courses.

Registration - Registration deadline is one week prior to each course. Participants must register for courses online at gsccc.org. Class sizes are limited by facility, type of course and number of facilitators. **Fees** - Courses are offered at a minimal cost to participants to cover materials associated with the course. Fees must be included at the time of registration and will not be taken by the facilitator at the time of the class.

Cancellations - Classes are planned for the number of persons enrolled by registration deadline. If you will not be attending, you must cancel at least three days prior to the class. To cancel, call the council office at

If classes are cancelled by the council due to low enrollment or unforeseen circumstances, every effort will be made to contact individuals in a timely manner. Credits/Refunds - Credits or refunds will only be issued for council initiated class cancellations or when registration cancellations are made at least three days prior to the start of class. A credit for the full cost of the class will automatically be applied to your account for future adult learning or program registrations. Requests for refunds must be made in writing and will only be issued in amounts greater than \$10.

- Courses will begin and end promptly. To receive credit for the course, you must arrive on time and stay for the entire course.
- Do not bring children to adult volunteer courses. Babysitting services are not available.
